Course description (According to the University Catalogue)

This course is designed for BA students of Chinese Department, Philadelphia University. It

is intended to develop students' basic English-Chinese translation skills for their further Chinese learning. The criteria of translation, basic differences between Chinese and English, and concerned theories, such as the dynamic equivalence theory, will be discussed, and detailed translation skills such as transformation of voices, change of sentence orders, etc. will be demonstrated with examples and practice. By taking this course, students will understand the basic differences between the Chinese language and the English Language, and learn to make mutual translation between the two languages to build a foundation for their further study of English-Chinese translation.

Course objectives:

To enable students to

1. learn the basic differences between the Chinese language and English language and understand basic translation theories.
2. translate texts from Chinese to English.
3. translate different types of texts, mainly literary works, newspaper articles, documents, certificates, etc.

Teaching methods(Lectures, discussion groups, tutorials, problem solving, etc)

This course is mainly involved in classroom lectures, and group discussions are frequently done inside and outside lectures. The teaching activities will be designed to get the students actively involved; teaching materials will be designed to help the students improve their language proficiency. For each week, at least one-hour group tutorial is arranged for BA students in

Chinese Department office.

Learning outcomes:

- Knowledge and understanding

(1) Get to know the basic differences between the Chinese language and English language, such as the different sentence order with the position of adverbials.

(2) Be familiar with some theories of translation, such as the dynamic equivalence theory proposed by Eugene Nida, and the Skopo Theory by Vermeer.

Cognitive skills (thinking and analysis).

(1) Learn to realize the importance of cooperation and teamwork; (2) Practice on logical thinking and management of daily studies and life, and form good habit especially on studies; (3) Learn to explore and form academic interest; (4) Learn to listen to and observe other people and their cultures, and learn to learn; (5) Learn to recognize the value in both Arab culture and Chinese culture.

- Communication skills (personal and academic).

(1) Master some translation skills; (2) Be able to translate some sentences and essays with the help of dictionaries and online resources.

- Transferable Skills.

(1) Common purpose language competence enables students to easily cope with real-time situations in real language context in China or in other Chinese language-related situations; (2) Chinese language knowledge and skills equip students with ability to cope with political, economic, cultural, and other situations not only in China, but also in other southeastern Asian countries and any Arab country where Chinese language or cultural background is involved in real-time situations (conference, teaching, translation, tourism, etc.) or in written forms (translation, documents and documentation, etc.); (3) Cognitive and communication skills help students to deal with any problem-solving situations other than China or Chinese language-related contexts.

- Psychomotor Skills (When applicable)

(1) Chinese language learning (character writing, acquaintance to historical changes of Chinese characters) practices and strengthens students psychological and physical balance; (2) Some Chinese art and culture skills (taiji, hulusi, calligraphy and traditional painting,

paper-cutting, etc.) help with students psychological and physical development.
