

Erasmus+ 2021-2027: Objectives

Article 1 of the Erasmus+ Regulation:

The general objective of the Programme is to support, through lifelong learning, the educational, professional and personal development of people in the fields of education and training, youth and sport, in Europe and beyond, thereby contributing to sustainable growth, quality jobs and social cohesion, to driving innovation and to strengthening European identity and active citizenship. The Programme shall be a key instrument for building a European Education Area, supporting the implementation of European strategic cooperation in the field of education and training, including its underlying sectoral agendas, advancing youth policy cooperation under the 2019-2027 European Union Youth Strategy and developing the European dimension in sport.



Specific objectives of the programme

Article 2 of the Erasmus+ Regulation:

To promote the learning mobility of individuals and groups, and cooperation, quality, inclusion and equity, excellence, creativity and innovation at the level of organisations and policies in the field of education and training;

To promote non-formal and informal learning mobility and active participation among young people, and cooperation, quality, inclusion, creativity and innovation at the level of organisations and policies in the field of youth;

How? Three Key Actions: **KA1** – learning mobility; **KA2** – cooperation among organisations; **(KA3** – policy development)



Complementarity with EU actions on the ground in Jordan

- Education a key sector for both Jordan and the EU
- Since 2011, the EU has supported Jordan with over 380 million euros in the education sector overall (primary, secondary, technical and vocational education and training, higher education)
- The EU has also supported the education sector in Jordan in its courageous efforts amid the Syrian crisis
- Erasmus+: a people-to-people, bottom-up programme, that brings together EU and Jordan stakeholders working together towards common challenges

Priorities of the Erasmus+ Programme


- Transversal to the different actions of the programme
- Reflected through specific mechanisms but also as a qualitative element of support projects
- Introduced in Part A of the Programme Guide, outlining the underlying policy framework and the main objectives
- For each action, narrative guidance has been added under the section "setting up a project", linking to these priority areas



Main features of the Inter'l Dimension of the new programme

- Strong international dimension, linked to the European Education Area and the Digital Education Action Plan, allowing:
 - cooperation between education and training institutions,
 - > strengthen Europe's reputation,
 - > support the green and digital transitions,
 - > focus on inclusion.
- Closer alignment of European int'l cooperation actions with the EU priorities.
- Foster greater coordination among the EU and MS, strengthen Europe's positioning as a key partner in education at global level and cement the links between the European Education Area and the rest of the world.
