Course module description

This course will be concerned with the development of architecture since the industrial revolution till now . Lectures will particularly emphasize on the Social, Economic, Political, transformations along with the development of materials and technology, and their effects on architecture trends and architects , and the trends

Course module objectives

The main objectives of this course will be to enable the students to :

- Identify and read the architectural works of this period.
- Analyze and criticize the architectural works.
- Evaluate architectural works.

Course/ module components

• Literature in Theory of Architecture :

The students will be advised and encouraged to expand and improve their knowledge by reading books and publications concerning the subject, but they will have to read some chosen texts from the list of references that is mentioned at the end of the course syllabus, to establish a basic knowledage.

- Supportive materials Students will have to develop their knowledge in Architecture by visiting different sites and buildings, new architectural complexes, beside reading, and watching multimedia materials concerning the subject.
- Homework , (and laboratory guide if there is any needed) Students will be requested to prepare papers about the topics that fall into the area of the subject , and they would requested to present them in seminars .
- During this course , the students will be :
 - 1. exposed to the knowledge of theory and criticism
 - 2. familiarized with major works of architecture from the covered periods .
 - 3. enabled to recognize major works of architectural movements.
 - 4. specify stylistic characteristics of the various architectural movements.

Teaching methods

The structure of the course will be elaborated through theoretical lectures , enhanced by data shows , discussions and criticism debates . Students might be directed to read some assigned materials before the lecture .

Learning outcomes

The expected outcomes of this course would be revolved around :

• Knowledge and understanding :

The students will be expected to obtain a suitable understanding and comprehension of the architectural trends, styles, and architects' visions and works.

• Cognitive skills (thinking and analysis) :

The students will be expected to develop the abilities of observation, analysis and evaluation throughout carrying a research and writing their own reports during the semester.

• Practical and subject specific skills (Transferable Skills) :

The students are expected to develop the abilities of distinction between the Architectural features and styles and indentifying their era.

• Communication skills (personal and academic) :

The students will be expected to gain the ability to read, write, speak and listen effectively, that would develop skills in articulation and presentation of architectural concepts, written and verbal, and both personal and academic.
