When the traffic is bad, rickshaws find a way through it. If you miss your bus and can't find a taxi, you can always find a rickshaw. Rickshaws are also very popular with local shoppers. The driver takes you from your house to the market and waits for you. Then he loads all your purchases, drops you off outside your home, and helps you unload. No other type of public transportation offers this kind of service.

You also see lots more people getting on and off rickshaws during the monsoon season. That's the period from June to September when Kolkata gets heavy rainfall. Sometimes it rains for 48 hours without a break. In the older parts of the city, the roads flood. The water can rise as high as people's waists. When it's that bad, anything with an engine is useless. The rickshaw drivers never stop working, even with water all around them.

Not everyone thinks rickshaws are a good thing, though. Some local officials and politicians want to ban rickshaws on humanitarian grounds. They believe it is wrong for one man to pull another person when there is modern transportation available.
