Course Description

This course provides an understanding of the nurse's role in caring for the maternal populations. This course will address nursing care issues from a physiological, pathophysiological, and psychosocial context. This course builds on the concepts of previous nursing courses with emphasis on utilizing the nursing process in dealing with women's health and maternity, newborn, and child health.
